Students took part in a number of tasks which they completed with great confidence. They were, also, given a tour of the Corpus Christie Campus.

Normanton Parents' Evening

On the 20th June we held a successful community parents' evening at the Madeley Centre.

In partnership with Adem Repesa and his team (New Communities Achievement Team) we have been able to provide a community parents' evening for families whose first language is not English. This was the 2nd successful evening held this year, with more to be arranged for next year.

Teen Tech – Emirates Stadium

On the 20th and 21st March, Year 8 took part in a Teen Tech event where they have to design and build their vision for the 'City of Tomorrow' out of recycled items. All of the buildings were judged and three of the teams were successful in being invited to the national final. The final took place at the Emirates Stadium. The 12 pupils took part in a Microsoft challenge where they had to design a safer road system; they were presented with workshops by different industries including Rolls Royce and the MOD; and they had to deliver a presentation of their building to representatives from leading industries in the UK. One of our teams was, also, selected to interview the Secretary of State for Culture, Media and Sport - Matt Hancock.

All three CoDA teams won the 'best recreational and best outdoor space' awards, the 'Tree of Life Inn building award, and the team of Keisha, Amirah, Zoha and Jake were the overall winners of the Smarter, Kinder, and Safer Award.

Six of our Year 9 students took part in a 5 day programme (Yes! COMPaCT) with the Derbyshire Fire & Rescue Service. The pilot programme is part of their Youth Engagement Scheme; creating opportunities for young people's personal, social and educational development.

The programme includes; search and rescue techniques, basic first aid and resuscitation, communication skills, basic operational skills and team building. Students took part in a number of tasks; hose running, pumping water, ladder drill, fire awareness, aerial Ladder platform plus more. The programme completed with a Pass Out

Parade on Friday 8th June 2018. Students really engaged and excelled in the programme. All six were awarded certificates and were highly praised by the fire service.


Year 11 Prom/ Staff Video

Breakfast Club


Breakfast Club is available to all students, from 8.00am - 8.30am every morning.

CoDA Choir

Two schools come together in harmony! On January 25th 2018 students from CoDA and Merrill Academy joined together to participate in a vocal workshop, 'An Introduction to Singing Skills', devised and led by Cathryn Haywood, Musical Director of The Merrill Melody Makers.

Bianca Woods, Music Teacher/Coordinator at CoDA had heard the choir at a recent showcase and thought the student's ability to entertain and delight an audience was impressive. Bianca really wanted CoDA students to experience the 'buzz' of being part of a great musical experience.

Miss Haywood says, 'At the very first enrichment session, the sense of community, enthusiasm and engagement were really strong. I knew if we could develop the singer's confidence and self-esteem, alongside learning singing techniques and performance skills we could create something very special. I, also, know that reaching out and getting involved in combined projects is a wonderful way to share success and inspire others.' The idea of a joint singing workshop was formed.

Singers from both academies filled the music room. If there was any trepidation they certainly did not show it! Within minutes students were engaged. They were tasked to make, either a buzzing or humming noise, and they had to locate other students who were making the sound. This exercise required total focus and acute listening. The music room sounded like a giant bee hive!

Students were completely integrated and enjoyed using masks and mime to

demonstrate reactions without using the voice. This was a fun way to explore how body language can communicate to an audience.

Within twenty minutes, everyone participated in an improvised song based on the concept that in any successful team or group, individuals are a valued, are a vital component, a cog in the wheel. We were now a singing together in harmony as a 'pop up' choir!

It was great to witness, and be part of creating the powerful sound with students from year 7 to 11 and students from two different schools who had never sung together before. Any issues with age, gender, culture, ability, previous experience etc. were left at the door.

The second half focused on singing as one voice, and the joint choir began to work on songs that would form part of a working repertoire.

The joint choir were now 'buzzing' and performed all three pieces to several teachers, who were drawn to the music room by the singing, which could be heard from the reception area.

Student's comments included... 'I didn't want it to end...we were strangers at the start, but at the end we felt like friends...I can't wait to do it again...it was fun and I learnt such a lot too.'

The experience was such a success that we organised to meet on a regular basis. The singers now perform together, as a collaborative choir called 'Encore'. Even singing in two and three part harmony at Merrill Academy's Easter showcase! They have since performed at two major Teach First events at Nottingham University in May and June. Earlier July, they performed a programme of songs to over 200 year 6 student, visiting the school on transition day. The hall was filled with the sound of them and the audience joining in to sing one their anthems 'We are the Champions.' From September, Miss Haywood will be coming into school as a vocal coach, to develop the CoDA Chromatics own unique sound. Choirs are a community in themselves and can reach out to the wider community.

Miss Haywood says, 'I am thrilled to be coming to work at CoDA, the students have shown commitment and passion and I look forward to working with them on a regular basis.

As Karen carpenter once said 'We have only just begun...'.

Student Well-being
