GCSE Food Preparation

The Year 11 Food Preparation and Nutrition GCSE groups recently completed the practical element of their Non Exam Assessment. This involved planning, preparing and cooking three separate dishes within the three hour time limit.

Every single pupil managed to complete three dishes within the time available. A selection of the dishes made included: lasagne and other pasta dishes, made with homemade pasta, ratatouille, roast dinner, pizza, soufflé, panna cotta, flavoured mousses and crème caramel. The students each presented their dishes to an exceptional level, putting the presentation skills they have been learning to great effect.

The day was concluded with a fun quiz, testing the students on their learning. This was won by a team from the City of Derby Academy who were, also, competing against teams from 2 other schools attending on the day (Littleover and Murray Park) on a tie break question. The question was 'Estimate the population of the world', which was answered perfectly by the CODA team!
