Dear Parents/Carers

Advice to parents - confirmed case of COVID-19

I am writing to inform you that we have had a confirmed positive case of COVID-19 within school community at the City of Derby Academy.

Our immediate thoughts are with the member of the community and their family and I am sure you with join me in passing on our best wishes.

We have worked closely with the Department for Education (DfE) and Public Health England (PHE) to agree on the following measures that have been put in place.

We have contacted the parents/carers of the students who have been in 'close contact' with the person who has received a positive test result. The 27 students and 2 staff members will be self-isolating from Monday 19th October until Monday 2nd November 2020, which is a period of 14 days. In addition, they will be learning remotely from home.

The school will remain open for the rest of the students.

Please be assured that all preventative measures have taken place and will continue. Any classroom or other space that has been accessed by the student as already received an enhanced deep clean.

Students have been very responsible in following our control measures around school since the start of the term. We will be reassuring students during the course of the day of the situation and the actions which have been taken. This will also be a good opportunity to remind them of the important ways in which they can continue to stop the spread of the virus and we would be very grateful if you would remind them of the important points below.

- Face coverings need to be worn when children are traveling to and from school (public transport and cars).
- All students should wear face coverings whilst moving around the school.
- As a reminder, students need to be sanitising their hands throughout the school day
- Students should adhere to the hand, face and space advice from the Government, where appropriate
- Students should support good respiratory hygiene Catch it, Bin it, Kill it

What to do if your child develops symptoms of COVID-19

If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19, they must not come to school and should remain at home for at least **10 days** from the date when their symptoms appeared. Anyone with symptoms will be eligible for testing and this can be arranged via <u>https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test</u> or by calling 119.

All other household members who remain well, must stay at home and not leave the house for 14 days. This includes anyone in your 'Support Bubble'.

Further information is available at: <u>https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/covid-19-stay-at-home-guidance</u> The 14-day period starts from the day when the first person in the house became ill. Household members should not go to work, school or public areas and exercise should be taken within the home.

If you require help with buying groceries, other shopping or picking up medication, or walking a dog, you should ask friends or family. Alternatively, you can order your shopping online and medication by phone or online.

Symptoms

The most common symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are recent onset of:

- A new continuous cough
- A high temperature
- A loss of, or changing in, your normal sense of taste and smell

For most people, coronavirus (COVID-19) will be a mild illness.
