According to the INF, netball is played by more than 20 million people in more than 80 countries.








Make A Christmas Bauble!



Step one:

Use a glass and pencil to draw 12 circles onto the paper and cut them out. You cause as few or as many as you like.

Step two:

Fold all the circles in half and stack them on top of each other.

Step three:

Wrap a length of wire all the way around the stack so that it runs along the fold. Twist the ends together to secure. If you don't have wire you can also just staple the stack together, once at the top and at the bottom so that the staple sits right on the fold.

Step Four:

Stick a glue dot onto a circle, about 1/3 away from the bottom. Fold the facing flaps together and press to secure the bond. If you don't have glue dots you can use double sided tape or a bit of glue. Try not to use regular glue because it can warp the paper.

Step five:

On the next circle along, stick a glue dot about 1/3 the way from the top. Continue like this all the way around. Alternating high and low glue dots.

Now you can attach a ribbon and hang it on your Christmas tree or give it as a gift for someone!

- -Colourful paper or card
- -a pencil
- -something circular to trace around
- -scissors
- -Mini glue dots or glue or double sided tape
- -craft wire or a stapler

Their project is Metamorphosis, this means a major change in the form or structure of something. At the moment they are combining 3 images together, to create and change the animal into something different.



























Welcome year 7's


