Maths Success




Technology Success

English Success




Music Success

German Bun Recipe – Tornie S

Sorry I am only replying now but I actually do have the recipe for my German germknodel, Ingredients: 500g strong bread flour 1 tsp sea salt 3 tbsp caster sugar 30g fresh/dried yeast 250-300ml whole milk 35g unsalted Butter,melted 2 medium free-range eggs, beaten 10 tbsp of plum jam Poppy seeds and icing sugar to serve (I used chia seeds)

Method:

Mix the flour with the salt and sugar in a large bowl. Mix the yeast with 2 tbsp of milk and leave it for a few minutes until it starts to froth. Add this and the rest of the milk, the 35g melted butter and the eggs to the flour. Mix to form a soft dough. Turn out onto a lightly floured surface and knead vigorously for 10 minutes. Put the dough back in the bowl and cover with a clean tea towel. Leave to rise somewhere warm for an hour or so until doubled in size. Lightly grease a baking sheet. Knock back the dough, then divide into 10 equal pieces. Flatten each piece out on the work surface, then dollop a spoonful of the plum jam into the centre. Bring the dough around the jam and seal well by pinching the edges together with your fingers. Put the parcels on the greased baking sheet, cover with the tea towel and leave to prove for 30-60 minutes or until doubled in size. Then gently steam the dumplings.I then put mine in the oven for 5 mins as I prefer a harder texture.

Then serve with a dollop of jam on top, poppy or chia seeds and any sauce of your preference.
