The very first rubber football was made from the sap of a rubber tree in 1855. Less than ten years later they invented the inflatable rubber ball.

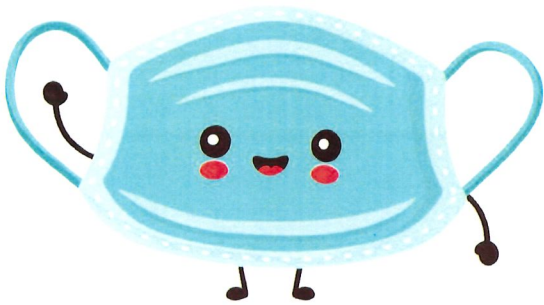
But before all of that the very first ball was made of a pig or a sheep's bladder which you would blow up and put in a leather case.

Right now the people are being vaccinated in our area.

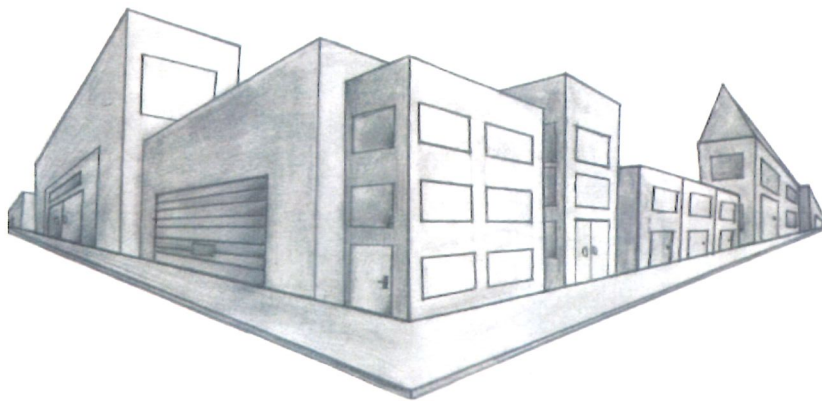

Japan



Yakitori is a Japanese type of kebab made out of chicken. To make it you need to get a skewer made of steel called kushi, it can also be made of bamboo. People tend to cook it on a fire. To make it even better they add tare sauce or salt to flavour it.





Donburi is a meal made out of rice that is almost as commonly eaten as ramen in Japan. It is made by frying various meat, fish and vegetables and is served over steamed rice in bowls. A lot of people use ingredients such as oyakodon (chicken, egg, and green onion) and gyudon (sliced beef and onion in a soy sauce soup)

Ramadan

Muslims, the followers of Islam, have a holy month called Ramadan. This month is used for praying, fasting and thinking.

Ramadan is celebrated as the month when the Holy prophet first received the revelations of the Quran, Islam's holy book.

Fasting is very important during Ramadan. Every day, during this holy month, Muslims will not eat or drink between sunrise and sunset. This allows them to devote themselves to their faith and come closer to their God, Allah.

Fasting is one of the five pillars of Islam, which form the basis of how Muslims live their life.





Here is a little craft for you to do this Easter! All you will need is a sock, some coloured markers, elastic bands, rice and scissors.

The first step is to draw a rabbits face on your sock.

Give it some buck teeth and a little smile! (If you want you can bring in googly eyes and make it extra cute!)

Cut a triangle out of the opening of the sock so it looks like a "v" shape (remember it's the opening that you need to cut like this)

After that fill your sock just before it reaches the mouth of your drawing and tie an elastic band right on top of the rice so it's very tight! Now put in some more rice to fill in the face and add one more elastic band to seal the top.

The "v" shape you cut earlier will act as ears and you will have an adorable little Easter buddy to sit on your desk.
