, seriou	What has improved in remote learning?
	Students like having remote lessons 5 lessons per day.
	They like it when staff record their lessons so that they can look back when they are stuck.
	They enjoy live interactions and like seeing their teachers and class. Staff respond quickly to emails.
	 What learning activities are the best in remote learning?
	Students like tried and tested activities such as Forms or working on paper.
	Onenote had a mixed response. Using Mathswatch works well too.
	They like interactive/practical activities e.g. PE.
	 What can we do to improve remote learning further?
	Students would like lessons to start promptly – some teachers are waiting for students to arrive.
	They suggest that a trusted student is given permission to admit students (this already happens in some classes).
	There was some concerns about Teams being unreliable and that students didn't always have an invite for lessons.

- 2. School provision in COVID times
 - What worked well with the COVID provision

The elements of COVID provision that students liked, they generally wanted to keep (see below).

 What changes would you like to be made in the future(bearing in mind that we need to remain COVID safe)?

Students (particularly from older year groups) wanted to be able to use the toilet unaccompanied.

Students would also like the toilets cleaned during the day.

• What aspects of our COVID provision would you like to keep when things return to normal?

The academy council unanimously would like to keep access to hand gel in classrooms and public areas.

Students liked having separate year group lunchtimes and entrances. They also liked teachers moving.

Wearing PE kit to school was very popular – they felt that they had more time to spend on PE.

3. What are student responses to our first 'Activities Day'? It looks like we are unlikely to be able to go out on trips in March – what would students like to see for the next 'Activities Day' rewards?

Gift card remain popular as does buying rewards on classcharts.

Students, particularly in younger year groups, were keen on in school rewards such as films.
