

The only way to pair off the red and blue numbers so each blue number is paired with a red number that it is divisible by is as shown below.



When the blue numbers are divided by the corresponding red numbers we obtain 31 34 33 32 30 36 35

$$\begin{aligned} \frac{31}{1} + \frac{34}{2} + \frac{33}{3} + \frac{32}{4} + \frac{30}{5} + \frac{36}{6} + \frac{35}{7} \\ = 31 + 17 + 11 + 8 + 6 + 6 + 5 = 84. \end{aligned}$$

The next step is to find a person to help you. It could be online? A neighbor? Family/friend? There is always help.. Your not alone!!!

#### Where to get help

If you're using a help line for support and still want to die or hurt
your self, tell the help line so they can give you advice. If you're using
a help line, call an ambulance or a person you trust and tell them that
you want to kill yourself. Ask them to help you get to a hospital, or go
there directly yourself. Or try and get someone to drive you, I
wouldn't advise you to travel on your own.

Things you could try to distract you're self:

- Meditate
- Yoga
- Talk to one of your friends
- Get some sleep
- Remind yourself about all of the good things in life
- Don't go on social media
