


Year 7 Link

At the City of Derby Academy we aim to provide outstanding, personalised support for every student which meets both their pastoral and academic needs. This will allow all students to achieve their full potential.

The move from primary school to a large secondary can be daunting. We recognise this and understand that students and parents need to feel reassured, happy and safe during this transition period. This pack aims to provide information which will help you through the transition process.

Year 6 students who have chosen to move to the City of Derby Academy from September 2024 will attend transition days. Students will have the opportunity to meet staff, tour the school and take part in a number of learning experiences.

Form Time

Students will spend the first part of every day in a mixed ability form group. During form time the form tutors will deliver an additional curriculum which supports QEGS (Question, Explore, Give, Succeed) learning.



Year 7 Curriculum

Year 7 students will study a broad and balanced curriculum. Our curriculum is tailored to the needs of different students. This includes additional support in English and Mathematics for those students who are below the required standards. Below is a guide of what a student can expect to study over every fortnight:

- 7-8 hours of English
- 7–8 hours of Maths
- 6 hours of Science
- 4 6 hours of Modern Foreign Languages
- 3 hours of History
- 3 hours of Geography
- 2 hours of Religious Studies
- 3 hours of Art
- 4 hours of PE
- 3 hours of Music and Drama
- 4 hours of Design and Technology
- 2 hours of PSHE



Some students will also be selected for curriculum pathways that provide additional support in areas of need.

We also have a wide range of extended opportunities. There are a large number of clubs and activities available at break time and after school. We also offer a range of trips and in school enrichment activities throughout the school year.

Catering

We do not allow students to leave the Academy site during the school day. Students are encouraged to eat either a school lunch or a packed lunch in our dining hall. At the City of Derby Academy we provide reasonably priced, healthy food options at both break and lunchtime. Our food is cooked on site in partnership with Derbyshire County Council. If students bring their own packed lunch please ensure that it is healthy. We do not allow energy drinks or fizzy drinks in school. Students may drink water in lessons, or we have water fountains in our corridors.

Student Lockers

ILS provides lockers for City of Derby Academy students. The lockers are owned by ILS and are available for students to rent on an annual basis.

Rental costs are £22 per year allowing use from September through to July. Please note all bookings terminate at the end of the school year in July. We apologise but there is no discount for lockers booked late in the year.

The locker size is as follows: Height: 595mm, Width: 300mm, Depth: 450mm

All rentals are subject to terms and conditions which are available during the booking process.

Please note ILS are a separate entity from the school and all dealings will be directly with ILS.

Uniform and Equipment

We enforce a strict uniform and presentation policy at the City of Derby Academy. Year 7 students will receive a free blazer and tie for September.

School Uniform

- City of Derby Academy blazer
- City of Derby Academy tie
- Optional City of Derby Academy or plain black v neck jumper to wear under a blazer
- Smart black trousers or skirt (sensible length skirt and not stretchy material)
- Plain white school shirt (not polo t-shirt)
- Sensible black school footwear

PE Uniform

- Suitable footwear for PE (trainers)
- City of Derby Academy PE top or plain black t-shirt
- Plain black PE shorts/tracksuit bottoms/skort/leggings
- Optional outdoor PE wear: black jumper/hat/gloves for winter, cap for the summer

Additional items:

- A warm coat for travelling to and from the school, hoodies are not allowed.
- Students can wear a watch and small stud earrings, a nose stud and one small item of religious jewellery.
- Students should not wear excessive make up or nails of an unsafe length.

Equipment for learning:

- A dark coloured, rucksack style bag suitable for carrying A4 books and equipment.
- All students should have their own black/blue pens, pencils, ruler, rubber, pencil sharpener and calculator. A planner and any other equipment needed for learning will be provided by the school.

Payment System

The City of Derby Academy operate a cashless payment system for lunch and trips, etc.

In line with many other schools, the City of Derby Academy has a biometric system where students' accounts are linked to their fingerprint pattern. This is safer and quicker than using money each day.

ParentPay should be used to "top up" your child's balance so they can use this towards lunch each day. You can also use this to pay for trips, revision guides, etc. For more information, please visit ParentPay's website: <u>https://www.parentpay.com/</u>

ParentPay activation letters will be distributed to students and parents/carers in September.

It is important that you keep a check on your child's balance to ensure they have enough on the account to buy snacks and lunches. Students who qualify for free school meals will have the correct amount added to their account every day.
