City of Derby Academy Greenpower Team International Success

The team set off from City of Derby Academy at Lunch time on Saturday, the final was at Goodwood, a historic track in West Sussex. We arrived just after 6pm at our accommodation at Lodge Hill. The team enjoyed Pizza and a few games of table football and ping pong. The batteries were stowed away in the airing cupboard to keep them warm!

Arrival at the track was 7:15am so breakfast was consumed quickly and we rolled away at 6:55am. After the disappointing outing at Blyton Park we were hoping for a fantastic result. The car is off-loaded and we headed to scrutineering, the car is checked over carefully to make sure we stick to the rules. Passed!

Practice goes well, with a few laps for most of our drivers. Kaitlin continues to grow in confidence and achieves a lap at nearly 100% throttle! The car is reported as being quite slow, which we are really confused about as it has a step-up in gearing and our nice new speed controller.

Race 1 is an hour and a half long, first stint goes to star driver Conrad who navigates traffic well. Alayna and Cain also have brilliant drives. Our pit stops are fast and we stay out of trouble. We finish 19th out of 47 kit cars. All of the drivers report the car feeling slow, and this is reflected in the lap times – we are slower than last year despite all of our upgrades!

The long lunch break is spent trouble-shooting. Our tyres aren't up to the pressures required – an easy fix. We are also down on power. The throttle wasn't telling the motor controller to go at 100%. Derby Grammar school are brilliant and lend us a drill and a switch, and we set to work fixing the problem. The car is now wired correctly, and we expected to see an improvement for race 2.........`

.....and WHAT an improvement. With full throttle we were able to knock a whole minute off our lap time. With 10 laps gone we were in the lead and then disaster struck! Another car crashed, flipped over and the race was red-flagged. This meant the race was never going to be long enough for the distance to beat race 1. After a bad pitstop, City of Derby Academy ended race 2 in 4th place out of 47 Kit cars. Well done to Conrad, Deep, Kaitlin, Alayna, Cain! We will be looking out for new members for the new season, in which we are sure to continue to build on this success.




