Spotlight on Departments:




This week's department - Science:


This week year 7 have been focussing on some chemistry skills.

Students were investigating what temperature water dissolved the most salt.



Miss Williams and Mrs Scanlon's class have been separating rock salt Students started by adding water to the rock salt to dissolve the salt and then filtered it to remove the sand.



Students then evaporated the water to leave the salt behind.




Mrs Russell's' class have been separating ink using chromatography.
