




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Everyone at the City of Derby Academy would like to take the opportunity to wish our whole community a Happy New Year.

9**S**M


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Each form group received a box of chocolates.

This week's department - PSHE:

We are excited to be teaching CODA student's our PSHE curriculum, the skills and knowledge are vital to improving the life chances of our students.

We are about to start the next topics within PSHE for Spring 1;

- Year 7 Explain how to appropriately challenge prejudice, stereotypes, and discrimination, and recognise the signs and effects of all types of bullying.
- **Year 8** Identify gender identity and gender-based discrimination and explain how to develop self-worth and confidence in oneself.
- **Year 9** Evaluate positive relationships within the home and appraise strategies to prevent homelessness among young people.
- **Year 10** Evaluate the opportunities and risks associated with forming relationships online and demonstrate knowledge of safe and responsible online behaviour and to appropriately respond to coercion and exploitation.
- Year 11 Describe how to communicate assertively and effectively to express wants and needs in relationships and explain how to manage unwanted attention, including appropriately challenging harassment and stalking.
