Religious Studies Trip:

On Friday, the 17th Mrs Beeson and Miss Baker took a group of Religious Studies GCSE students and year 11's with an interest in law and policing to the National Justice Museum in Nottingham.

In the morning, we looked at what punishment was like from the 1400's, 1700's and 1800's, experiencing some of the gruelling conditions and strict prison wardens! We then debated the matter of capital punishment, with one team arguing in support of capital punishment and one against. The session leader was seriously impressed with the quality of their arguments! We finished the day off re-enacting the real-life trial of Derek Bentley in an old courtroom, where our students acted as judge and jury! Our students were more lenient in finding him not guilty- the opposite of the 1952 decision. If you would like to read more about the trial, please follow this

Etihad Stadium GCSE PE/Sports Studies Trip:


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We took 49 students to the Etihad Stadium in Manchester on a trip which will support them with their GCSE PE and Sports Studies course.

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Spotlight on Departments:



<u> This week's department – History:</u>

GCSE History will encourage and enable students to:

- Gain an understanding of how Britain changed, as well as a widerworld view.

- Analyse and interpret sources, questioning their utility and reliability.

- Use grammar correctly, punctuate and spell accurately

- Think critically about historical events and come to substantiated judgements on them.

- Link events together chronologically and work out why things happened the way that they did.

- Write accurately, effectively and analytically about historical events.

- Acquire and apply a wide range of specialist vocabulary.
- Read a wide range of historical extracts and explain their ideas.

GCSE History at CODA

Paper 1: Medicine in Britain, c1250 to present and The British sector of the Western Front: injuries, treatment and the trenches 52 marks 30% weighting 1 hour 15 minutes

Paper 2: Superpower relations and the Cold War, 1941–91 and Early Elizabethan England, 1558–88 64 marks 40% weighting 1 hour 45 minutes

Paper 3: Weimar and Nazi Germany, 1918–39 52 marks 30% weighting 1 hour 20 minutes

Students will be taught and assessed on their ability to ...

AO1 · Demonstrate knowledge and understanding of the key features and characteristics of the periods studied.

AO2 · Explain and analyse historical events and periods studied using second order historical concepts (causation, consequence, similarity, difference, change, continuity and significance).

AO3 · Analyse, evaluate and use sources (contemporary to the period) to make substantiated judgements, in the context of historical events studied.

AO4 · Analyse, evaluate and make substantiated judgements about interpretations (including how and why interpretations may differ) in the context of historical events studied.

GCSE History Department Trip:

On 16th January, we took over 30 Year 11 GCSE History Students to Hardwick Hall. The students had a chance to look around the house and gardens, which will help them with their knowledge of Elizabethan England. All students were incredibly well-behaved and did the school proud.



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PSHE Update:

We are excited to be teaching CODA student's our PSHE curriculum, the skills and knowledge are vital to improving the life chances of our students.

We are currently on our Spring term 1 with one lesson to go.

Year 7 - Identify how to respond appropriately to bullying of any kind, including online, and explain how to provide support to others in need.

Year 8 -How to recognise and safely challenging homophobia, biphobia, racism, and religious discrimination.

Year 9 - Explain methods to manage conflict in relationships, navigating changes such as separation and divorce, and utilising support services for family-related issues.

Year 10 - Analyse the influence of media and pornography on sexual attitudes and behaviours and understand the ethical and legal considerations for consent.

Year 11 - Explain various forms of relationship abuse and access support to overcome challenges in abusive relationships.
