We had bits of time in between our scheduled activities to explore the site ourselves and see the exhibitions, and everyone agreed that this needed to be much longer! We saw inside the mansion, the huts where the code breaking actually happened, saw a replica Bomb machine working away, and some vintage vehicles in the garages.

The last part of our day was a guided tour, during which our students wowed the tour guide with their curiosity and cheerful nature, and their knowledge about World War 2 (shout out to the history department!!).

All in all, it was a fantastic day out, and all the students (and staff) agreed that they'd love to go again.

Music Department News:



In PSHE lessons, our students are currently studying the following topics:

Y7SP2L3 - Explain how to recognise and respond appropriately to inappropriate and unwanted contact to ensure personal safety.

Y8SP2L3 - Explain digital resilience and identify healthy and unhealthy coping strategies in relation to IT use.

Y9SP2L3 - Take informed responsibility for own health through healthy eating choices and regular self-examinations.

Y10SP2L3 - Develop and implement strategies for personal safety in situations involving substance use and gangs, and access support to reduce harm for oneself and others.

Y11SP2L3 - Recognise the links between lifestyle choices and cancer risk, and explain prevention strategies, and make informed decisions about personal health and well-being, including blood, organ, and stem cell donation.
