

Spotlight on Departments:



This week's department - Religious Studies:

Over the last half term and for the next students will be exploring lots of exciting topics in Religious Studies!

Year 7- Have been exploring 'what does it mean to be Christian?', thinking about the practices and beliefs of Christians and thinking about why Jesus was such an important figure. Our next module will see us move onto looking at 'What does it meant to be Muslim', we will be exploring important beliefs and festivals!

Year 8 have been exploring if 'suffering is proof there is no God'. We have debated why atheists think suffering is proof there is no God, and what the religious arguments are.

Year 9 have been considering whether religion is more of a cause of conflict than it is peace, we have looked at the ongoing conflict between Isreal and Palestine, and religious and non-religious beliefs about conflict.

Year 10 statutory have been exploring issues around prejudice and discrimination, and how religion deals with that, whilst GCSE classes have been learning about the practices and beliefs of both Christians and Muslims.

Year 11 statutory are currently looking at some of the challenges facing religious teenagers identifying in British society. GCSE students have been exploring issues of crime and punishment and thinking about the 'best' ways to punish criminals.

World Book Day!


World Book Day is taking place on Thursday the 6th of March and we have loads of ways we'll be celebrating at coda!

We are about to start the next topics within PSHE for Spring 2;

Y7SP2L2 - Explain how to manage influences related to caffeine, smoking, and alcohol, and describe how to navigate the physical and emotional changes during puberty.

Y8SP2L2 - Create effective wellbeing routines into daily life to support mental health and manage emotions.

Y9SP2L2 - Describe the importance of balancing work, leisure, exercise, and sleep to maintain overall well-being.

Y10SP2L2 - Assess the media's portrayal of gang culture and evaluate the impacts and consequences of drugs and alcohol on individuals, families, and communities.

Y11SP2L2 - Explain and apply emergency first aid skills and evaluate emergency and non-emergency situations to determine appropriate actions and contact relevant services promptly.
