
Congratulations to all those who won vouchers in the attendance rewards before Easter. We hope you enjoyed it as they were brought back by student voice!

10x 1\* CIS (Radio and Signals) passes
18x St Johns Ambulance Youth First Aid Course (equivalent to 3 day adult FAAW)

That is an amazing 72 improvements to life chances in a term!

Our Running total for this year is **204 qualifications**.... Last year, our cadets gained **176**!

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#### Spotlight on Departments:

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## <u>This week's department – Music:</u> 🚿

I am exciting to introduce you to our new music teacher Mr Heneghan who will be starting at CODA at May Half Term. Mr Heneghan grew up in Normanton and has been a music teacher for almost 5 years. He is currently working in another local school and is looking forward to starting in his new school soon.

This half term is very busy for the music department as we prepare the GCSE Music students for their performance recordings. Each student has to perform at least 3 minutes of solo performance and ensemble. This forms 30% of the final grade.

The year 10s are also busy beginning practice sessions for their Non-exam assessment coursework which is done in controlled conditions from September. This forms 30% of the final grade.

Year 7 students are looking at world music, exploring music from different places around the world including Bhangra, African drumming, and Chinese traditional music.

Year 8 students are learning about Samba, the music of the Rio carnival. They are looking at the links between Brazil and African slaves and how the Favelas have influenced this music.

Year 9 are doing Ukulele skills along with careers in music and the influence of social media on music.

## <u>PE Department News!</u>

In Year 10 and 11 PE lessons, our students have recently been taking part in 1<sup>st</sup> Aid courses and Disability Sports to widen their experiences of Physical Activity and Sports outside of our normal curriculum.

The students have enjoyed taking part in Boccia, Seated Volleyball, Blind Football and Inclusive Dance.



# PSHE Update:

We are excited to be teaching CODA student's our PSHE curriculum, the skills and knowledge are vital to improving the life chances of our students.

We are about to start the next topics within PSHE for Summer 1;

Year 7 - Identify qualities and behaviours of positive relationships, explain how to recognise unhealthy relationships, and strategies to evaluate expectations for romantic relationships

Year 8 -Explain what consent is, the laws that apply, and justify the importance of clear communication and gaining consent and Identify appropriate contraception to stay healthy and safe.

Year 9 - Recognise the consequences of unprotected sex and the importance of practicing safer sex through effective use of condoms and negotiation.

Year 10 - Recognise signs of extremism and radicalisation, and effectively respond to such behaviours.

Year 11 - Identify and describe fertility variations and changes, explore the processes of pregnancy, birth, and miscarriage, and explain their implications for family planning and reproductive health.
